CELEBRATING PENTECOST IN WORSHIP

SOME IDEAS!

1. Invite everyone to wear red.

Provide red streamers, strung beads, scarves etc for anyone who forgets.

2. Balloons

- a. Hang red, yellow and orange balloons from the ceiling of your church.
- b. Pentecost colours, with helium, on strings—attached to the end of each pew.

3. Visuals

- a. Decorate your worship space with the symbols of Pentecost: tongues of fire, doves. Use banners or pennants.
- b. Invite children to cut out doves and pass them out during the passing of the peace.

4. Readings

- a. Have several people (prepared beforehand) to share about the gifts God has given them and how they use them for ministry and spreading God's word.
- b. Invite several people (scattered throughout the congregation) to read the reading from Acts 2:1-21. Make sure they have their part ahead of time to practise.
- c. Invite people throughout the congregation to read the reading from Acts 2:1-21, simultaneously in different languages.

5. Song suggestions

- d. All Together 359 Holy Spirit Living Water

6. Morning Tea

Provide a special "birthday party" morning tea following your worship service:

- a. Birthday cake! You could use candles that never blow out—talk about how the church will also never be extinguished!
- b. Sing Happy Birthday to the church.
- c. Invite members to bring dove or flame-shaped biscuits.
- d. Other party food could include red, yellow and orange fruit platters.
- e. Red jelly cakes.
